Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

April is shaping up to be a great month for us here at St. Michael's. Besides enjoying the beauty of spring and welcoming back some of our 'snowbirds', Bishop Solak will be here on Saturday, April 20th at 11:00 a.m. to officially install me as the Sixth Rector of St. Michael's. It's been thirty-six years since this has occurred at St. Michael's, so you may not have participated in a service like this before. It is a very special liturgy and doesn't occur very often.

There is a liturgy called "The Celebration of New Ministry" in the Book of Common Prayer on page 559. The Bishop is the celebrant and preacher, and she will read and present me with the Letter of Institution. Rectors have specific canonical status within the diocese and

particular responsibilities. The congregation takes part in the Institution, just as we do at a baptism, taking vows to support the ministry of the new rector.

At the Induction part of the service representatives of the congregation present the new rector with a variety of gifts that are symbols of our new ministry together. These include a Bible, a vessel of water, a stole, a book of prayers, oil, keys, a copy of the Canons, and bread and wine. Other gifts are sometimes offered as symbols of other aspects of the new rector's ministry, such as a children's bible, a hymnal, a pectoral cross, or a home communion kit.

The most solemn part of the service is when the new rector kneels in the midst of the church and prays, "O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do.....". I remember praying this prayer 13 years ago on March 17th at Good Shepherd in Parkersburg, West Virginia. It felt like being ordained to the priesthood again.

"The Letter of Institution" is found on page 557 in the Book of Common Prayer. It contains this paragraph, "Having committed yourself to this work, do not forget the trust of those who have chosen you. Care alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. By your words, and in your life, proclaim the Gospel. Love and serve Christ's people. Nourish them, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come." I feel privileged that you have called me and given me the opportunity to fulfill these promises, which I will faithfully keep to the best of my ability.

Invitations will soon be going out, so put it on your calendar now, and make plans to attend. A bishop once told me the first time he conducted a Celebration of a New Ministry he felt like he was conducting a wedding. In a way that is what we are doing, standing before God, and taking solemn vows to serve Christ together and love one another.
