Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Vestry and I are currently in the process of evaluating how to support existing ministries, re-establish some, and establish new ones. Among these ministries are Sunday school for children, ministry to youth, the Outreach and Parish Life committees, our relationship with the Wood Bridge Pre-School, our Music Ministry, paid staff, Holy Hikes, and the Theology Pub.

There is an important concept for all Christians to understand about serving God. It's called 'kairos', a Greek term which essentially means 'in God's time'. 'Kairos' is distinguished from 'chronos' which is measuring time from hour to hour, day to day, week to week, month to month, year to year, etc. Most of us live by the latter in terms of planning and expectation, and indeed, we must live this way for practical reasons.

However, with God, one day is like a thousand, and a thousand like one day. So, we pray, listen to God, try to discern His will, and trust Him. We discover that if something truly is God's will—and not our own, He will bless it. This often requires a bit of patience. Sometimes we move deliberately so as not to waste precious time and energy with things that are not timely. This is not to say that we cannot jump on a good opportunity that suddenly presents itself. Sometimes God works that way too.

It may seem that things are moving slowly at St. Michael's in terms of re-establishing Sunday school for children and youth, or launching a Theology Pub for young adults, but this does not mean things are not progressing behind the scenes. One of the greatest lessons I had to learn the hard way in my first years of ordained life was that 'every good idea doesn't necessarily have to happen right away'.

However, I believe we should offer Sunday school for children and youth in September. Re-establishing Sunday School will have to begin with those families who can be here regularly enough and with teachers who are willing to be prepared even when no children come. Teachers may have to check in with families every week to plan their lessons.

The first task is preparing the Sunday school rooms for use by the end of the summer. On June 15<sup>th</sup>, we hope to clear out the Sunday school rooms and keep the materials that might be useful. We need your help, please come to help us.

The second task is recruiting and training Sunday school teachers. If you are feeling called to ministry with our children, I assure you it will be one of the most rewarding experiences you can ever have. Recently, after months of teaching the pre-schoolers at Wood Bridge the Lord's Prayer, I became aware that they were so mimicking how was I teaching it to them that they were developing 'Southern' accents! So often we do not realize the impact we are having on the young people around us. Please let me or any member of vestry know if you would like to help with ministry to children and youth, or if you have questions or suggestions.

#### **LET'S TALK ABOUT "THE STOLE"**

April 20, 2024 was a very special day. After 35 years we had the installation of the sixth rector of St. Michael's of the Valley with the Celebration of a New Ministry service. This service involves vows taken, prayers said and gifts given.


Of the nine gifts given one was a stole. The stole is one of the oldest Christian symbols of ordained clergy and ours was made even more special with the collaboration of Trevor Floyd and Juliet Hemingway. When you get a chance take a close look at the stole and you will notice that all the symbols are an integral part of St. Michael's – the dogwood, the rainbow trout, the pheasant, St. Michael the archangel all are from the kneelers that are used every Sunday - of course we can't forget the Church itself.

This was a process that the committee began started back in June of last year with the final product being shipped to us in December. So how is this accomplished – first you find a contact, then there is a design idea, a lot of correspondence, a couple of "designs on paper", color swatches, back and forth approval, placement of the order, send to the embroiderer and then wait.

In doing some investigation as to how to prepare a special stole I was put in touch with Trevor Floyd and Co. out of New Jersey and Juliet Hemingway Church Textiles in the United Kingdom. After my initial contact, I spoke to Trevor of our ideas then sent him photos of the church and the kneelers. He then started to put his ideas on paper and along with Juliet came up with a design. After the final design was approved, the order was placed and off to England it went and into the very capable hands of Juliet to embroider. After we received the stole the hard part was keeping it under wraps until the installation service when we would say the words:

"Marjorie, receive this stole, and be among us as a pastor and priest."
